Minutes of the Previous AGM: Minutes of the 2018 Annual General Meeting were taken as read. A motion to approve the Minutes was put forward and carried.

Wascoe Siding

July 7

The day started off cool, damp and very foggy.

Shane & Trevor arrived at the Penrith starting point to find no one there. Being very foggy there was no chance of a photo. The B44 was not happy so Shane decided to go the safe route and head back home leaving Trevor to head off to Yarramundi into the whiteness.

Now it was a very foggy day and no sane motorcyclist would venture out in such weather, but we are BSA riders and by virtue of that definitely not sane. Nevertheless Trevor hoped that there would be no one there so he could grab the white cane and tap his way back home.

However he was wrong (normally is) and there were X other riders waiting for him to lead them through the mountains via the back roads.

However as to the sanity of BSA riders compared to normal motorcyclist this was the first ride in decades when BSAs outnumbered all other marques. Not only did BSA outnumber the rest of the bikes added together, but 3 of them were girder fork models.

The fog looked like it was lifting and by the time the group made the first regrouping stop at the Hawkesbury road lookout, a fine cool day was revealed, the riders now having a splendid view over the top of the low clouds they had been riding through.

Taking heart at the better conditions they decided to do a different route to last year so turned right at Springwood, riding on roads to the south of the highway to the Corridor of Oaks, where in a civilized manner they decided not to urinate on their least favourite Prime Minister's tree (although more than one deserved it).

The group continued along these roads to the next stop 1/2 mile away to say hello to Henry Parkes as most had not been to his grave site before.

From there the original plan was to cross the highway and have a coffee stop at the really good cafe & pie shop that USED to be there when Trevor lived









meet at the Shell garage at Heathcote at 8:30 a.m.


