A65 PISTON TOOLS

Torquing the camshaft nut, oil pump drive and its locknuts are always part of the joy of rebuilding an A65 motor.

The workshop manual says to lock the engine using a rod through the con rod big end eyes, resting on hardwood pads to avoid denting the crankcase mouth. Actually, the manual says to use this for the alternator nut and clutch centre nut as well, which seems a little brutal for their 55 or 60 ft. lb. Torque.

An alternative to the pads of hardwood is a piston support plate, which is primarily intended for installing the cylinder. There are lots of ways to make these. One method is described below.

Little end rod

This is relatively simple. The gudgeon pins are 0.750" diameter, and a sliding fit in the little end bushes. The support rod was machined from a 300mm length of 20mm Al round bar, machined down to 0.749". Anything from 0.748" to 0.750" should be fine. The intention is to have a loose

sliding fit in the little ends, and to distribute the load across the full upper half of the bushes.

If dimensionally accurate $\frac{3}{4}$ " or 19mm aluminium or brass rod is available, that will save some work. 19mm is 0.748", so is probably simplest.

Piston Support Plate

The support plate is a little trickier, partly because of BSA's habit of spacing holes at multiples of 1/16".

This plate was made using 300mm of 19mm wide by 3mm thick Al.

The slots are approximately 5" deep.

The outer slots are $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide for the outer cylinder base studs.

The inner slots are 1 3/8" wide, to clear the inner studs and the con rod little ends.

The outer to inner slot spacing is 7/8", and the space between the inner slots is 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Slightly wider inner slots will give more clearance.

Ideally, mill the slots. My mill isn't particularly heavy duty, so the slots were roughed out with a thin cutoff wheel in an

angle grinder, and finished with a $\frac{1}{2}$ " slot drill (2-flute milling cutter)

A bandsaw, metal jig saw, or similar should do the trick nicely.

7) Ride Reports:

- The Zig Zag ride event was discussed. Only a couple of BSAs but they were of considerable interest to members of the public on the day. Peter asked that members make an effort to ride BSAs to the events wherever possible. Otherwise, the day was very enjoyable. It was the opening day for the railway following years of setbacks. A ride to Thirlmere was raised as an idea for a future club event.

- 9) Other Business and Matters Arising from Correspondence:

1. Club bank account matters:

- Peter W confirmed that the new Club general account had been established with the Bendigo bank. All withdrawals need the approval of minimum two signatories. Currently President Peter and Treasurer Victor are signatories. The new Secretary will be the third. Funds are being progressively moved to the new Club account.
- The existing ANZ account will remain for the time being as membership dues go into this account and some recurring payments are established from this account. Will progressively transfer these to the new Club account.
- Peter W advised that they are still trying to get ANZ to respond to our letter of complaint.

5. AGM: planning to have the AGM on 3rd August. John M to start preparing the paperwork. Craig has advised that he will be stepping down from the Secretary role at the AGM.

6. Spare parts: There was good discussion on the best places to buy parts and get work done. Thropshire Classic Motorcycle Parts was mentioned. Steve A reported that electric starter kits are now available for A65s.

Next meeting: Will be a combined Zoom and Wentworth Hotel meeting.

There being no further General Business, the Ordinary General Meeting closed at 9:20 pm.

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


OH WHAT A TANGLED WEB...
